The Cult of the Onion (COTO) is a layered, terminal-driven descent into ritualized absurdity, where users unravel reality one peel at a time. At its core are The Layers, a cryptic hierarchy of access levels, each one deeper, stranger, and more fragmented than the last. Members advance through Ritual Missions—surreal public tasks ranging from harmless to haunting, designed not for utility, but for transformation. Completion earns badges, visible tokens of devotion displayed in the Badge Cabinet, while some actions unlock hidden content, Echoes, or provoke responses from Guardians, abstract figures enforcing the Order's unstable logic. The Bloom Terminal interface serves as both command line and confessional—housing access to the Peel Ledger, Garlic Watchlist, Redacted Archives, and the Peel Engine idle game, where layers unfold over time. Every element—missions, messages, glitches, and glitches-within-glitches—reinforces the central question: How many layers will you survive before the Bloom survives you?
